### Annual Report 2018-2019

Postgraduate Govt. College for Girls, Sector 11 (PG-GCG-11), Chandigarh, accredited **Grade 'A' with a GPA of 3.52** by NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council) and affiliated to Panjab University, is reputed throughout the country for excellence in academics and co-curricular activities. Established in 1956, it lives up to its motto, '**Courage to Know**', and strives to empower women with holistic education in tune with current trends. The campus, over 35 acres of lush greenery, colourful flora and modern infrastructure, provides the ideal ambience well suited for studies.

This year Team PG-GCG-11 has added many new feathers to its cap. Some of them are enumerated below:

- Topping the list of our achievements is the recent **National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF)** in which the college has been **ranked 68<sup>th</sup> in India out of 4000+** institutions of the country. This announcement was made by the Union Minister of Human Resource Development Sh. Prakash Javadekar. **PG-GCG- 11 is number 1** amongst all the colleges in the entire region of Punjab, Haryana and Himachal Pradesh.
- More than **sixty students** from the college participated in the **Swachh Bharat Summer Internship programme** launched by the **Ministry of Human Resource Development, New Delhi**. The students organised rallies, door to door campaigns and street plays to spread awareness about the importance of cleanliness.
- The college was chosen by the **Department of Industries, Chandigarh Administration** to conduct **Entrepreneurship Development Programmes** for the students. Seventy students enrolled in the three day programme hosted by the college.
- It's a matter of great pride that ours is the **first institution** in the city to have been accorded permission to start an **Innovation Cell** by The Ministry of Human Resource Development.

### SPECIAL AID FOR THE DIFFERENTLY ABLED

- Extra care is taken to ensure that our **differently-abled students'** stay in the college is comfortable. JAWS-talking software has been installed in the library and Braille sheets are distributed free of cost.
- Ramps have been constructed at various places to facilitate their movement.
- A special washroom has been constructed for them.

## SAHYOG

- *Sahyog*, a voluntary organisation that provides financial support to the less privileged section of students, has been established by the staff and students of PG-GCG-11. In the session 2018-19, Rs 42860/- has been disbursed to students belonging to the economically weaker strata of society.

## LIBRARY

The College Library is fully computerized with LIBSYS software has fully air conditioned Reading Hall, Reference Section, Newspaper Section.

Free internet facility is available in the library for the students. INELIBNET N-List facility to access online journals and books is also available. There is a faculty research centre equipped with computers with internet access for faculty members and research scholars. A Braille corner is set up for the visually challenged students. The library is equipped with CCTVs. The library is also provides the facility of E-kindle.

The Library has a collection of more than 95364 books, 122 magazines, 25 newspapers and Journals of various subjects. Books, magazines, journals and newspapers worth Rs. 4, 84,471/- have been purchased in the academic session 2018-19 and 300 text-books have been issued to needy and meritorious students for the entire academic session. Free books and stationery worth Rs. 80,000/- have been distributed among 308 SC/ST Students.

The PGGCG-11 is the first College in Chandigarh to introduce RFID system in the library. It simplifies the system of self check-in and check-out of books. This system is also anti-theft.

Library related competitions such as Reference Hunting, Slogan Writing, Book Jacket making and Book Hunting were organised on 20<sup>th</sup> February, 2019 in which approximately 120 students participated. Orientation programme was also organised for the new admitted students to get them familiar with library resources and library facilities and Book exhibitions were also displayed time to time on various topics to encourage reading habit among the students.

LCD is also displayed in the library where recent activities of the library, new arrivals and current affairs are exhibited regularly.

A workshop on "Web-based Educational Resources" was conducted by the college Library on 23<sup>rd</sup> Feb, 2019 under the aegis RUSA scheme for faculty, research scholars and post graduate students.

The library has also got institutional membership of National Digital Library of India (NDLI) for all faculty members and students. NDLI is a platform for all the learners with educational materials from primary to postgraduate levels and includes multiple subject domains.

### COLLEGE MAGAZINE

- *Abha*, the college magazine, showcases in pictorial form the achievements of the college and also provides a forum for the students to express their creativity on a wide range of issues in English, Hindi, Punjabi and Sanskrit. Ours is among the very few colleges, if any, to introduce e-magazine.

There is a fully equipped day care centre, a cosy cove recreation centre, an ATM, departmental store, health care salon, and an open air stage among our array of amenities. The addition of a Central Instrumentation Centre has given a fillip to scientific experiments. Most of the smaller open areas that were lying fallow have now been landscaped with flower beds and pergolas. Solar energy powers most of our college classrooms. Additionally, the seminar room has been given a radical makeover with new marble flooring, customised cushioned seats, air-conditioning, multimedia systems and furniture.

### FIST AND RUSA GRANT

▪ **Grant of Rs. 80 Lakhs** has been sanctioned to PGGCG-11 under FIST Program 2018-19 to strengthen Teaching and Research Facilities in all the Science departments of the college by Department of Science and Technology, Government of India.

▪ Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) of the MHRD, Government of India, has **granted Rs. 50 lacs** to PGGCG -11 for strengthening of infrastructure resources and to enhance quality education in the college. The grant will help in the establishment of new laboratories for existing programmes and for new programmes both at the level of PG and UG, new class rooms and support units etc.
