ANNUAL REPORT 2019-2020

Post Graduate Government College for Girls, Sector 11 (PG-GCG-11), Chandigarh, is a leading institution of the northern region. Over the years it has carved an enviable niche in the domains of academics, sports and co-curricular activities. Established in 1956, the college has been imparting quality education in the disciplines of Humanities, Sciences, Commerce and Computer Application both at the undergraduate and postgraduate level. Its faculty prepares students to make meaningful contributions to society as engaged citizens in a complex world. The well-manicured campus with beautiful flora is backed by modern infrastructure and provides the ideal ambience for the students to learn and evolve.

Enumerated below are some of our outstanding achievements in the session 2019-2020.

1. It is matter of pride for the institution that MHRD, Government of India has selected PGGCG-11, Chandigarh to establish an **Institution Innovation Council** to promote innovations, start-ups and entrepreneurship amongst students. The Institution's Innovation Council aims at conducting various innovation and entrepreneurship-related activities. The MHRD granted **Four Star Status** to the college based on performance parameters.
2. A **Memorandum of Understanding** was signed between the Principal, Prof (Dr.) Anita Kaushal and Dr. Varinder Garg, OSD to Union Health Minister- President PGIMER Chandigarh.
3. The college canteens were certified as the first "**Eat Right Campus**" of Chandigarh. An inspection team appointed by the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (**FSSAI**) found that all the college canteens were compliant with national standards of

hygiene and conferred the title on PG-GCG-11- another first among all the tricity colleges.

4. The Principal, Prof. (Dr.) Anita Kaushal was awarded a **Commendation Certificate** for rendering **meritorious service in the field of education**. The award was conferred by His Excellency Shri V.P.SinghBadnore on the occasion of the 73rd Independence Day.
5. The Principal, Prof (Dr.) Anita Kaushal was also honoured with a **Certificate of Appreciation for exemplary success in Electoral Literacy**. The award was conferred by, Shri Manoj Kumar Parida, Adviser to the Administrator, UT Administration.
6. PG-GCG 11 won the Overall trophy in the Panjab University Inter Zonal Youth and Heritage Festival for the **SEVENTH** consecutive year. The students participated in the Inter Zonal and Inter Varsity Youth Festival and bagged a rich haul of prizes in these events.
7. The college has installed the **Windrows Composting** system wherein all food waste from the college food service operations is collected and compost is generated from it.
8. The 8th edition of the **Chandigarh Literature Festival** was held from 8th-10th November, 2019 in association with the ADAB Foundation. The festival brought together writers and poets from different parts of India thus enabling a meaningful exchange of ideas.
9. A one-week **Faculty Development Programme** on “Education and Pedagogy in the Times of Digital Humanities” was organised in the college from 9th- 15th January 2020. The programme was organised jointly by the Departments of Psychology and Philosophy in collaboration with UGC- Human Resource Development Centre, Panjab University, Chandigarh under the aegis of RUSA
10. Ms. StanzinZangmo of B.SC.III (Medical) is a **member of Indian Women’s Ice Hockey Team**. She participated in Taiwan Cup held from 5th to 9th November 2019 at Chinese Taipei.
11. The college secured **1st** position in the folk-dance category and **2nd** position in the Best Maintained Campus category of the Rose Festival which was held from the **28th February-1st March 2020**.
12. A new hostel, Hostel no 04, was added to the existing infrastructure. It can accommodate 400 students and has many amenities and recreational facilities like

reading room, yoga room etc. for the students. Additionally, it has a lift and special washrooms for the speciallyabled students.

Our strong foundation in academics ensures that our students surpass the university pass percentage by a huge margin every session, with many of them securing merit positions in the University rankings (See Annexure I). SAHYOG

A voluntary organisation, *Sahyog*, that provides financial support to the less privileged section of students, has been established by the staff and students of PG-GCG-11. In the session 2019-20, 42 students belonging to the underprivileged section of society benefitted from the generous contributions made by the faculty.

SPECIAL AID FOR THE DIFFERENTLY ABLED

- Extra care is taken to ensure that our differently-abled students" stay in the college is comfortable. JAWS-talking software has been installed in the library and Braille sheets are distributed free of cost.
- Ramps have been constructed at various places to facilitate their movement.
- A special washroom has been constructed for them.

LIBRARY

The College Library is fully computerized with LIBSYS software and has an air-conditioned Reading Hall, Reference Section, Newspaper Section and Research Faculty Centre.

Free Internet facility is available in the library for the students. INFLIBNET N-List facility to access online journals and books is also available. There is a faculty research centre equipped with computers with internet access for faculty members and research scholars. A Braille corner is set up for the visually challenged students. The library is equipped with CCTVs.

The Library has a collection of more than 96201 books, 78 magazines, 15 newspapers and 11 Journals of various subjects and text-books are also issued to needy and meritorious students for the entire academic session. Free books and stationery worth Rs. 80,000/- have been distributed among 308 SC/ST Students.

PGGCG-11 is the first College in Chandigarh to introduce RFID system in the library. It simplifies pattern of self-check-in and check-out of books besides being anti-theft.

Library Orientation programme was organised for the new admitted students to familiarize them with library resources and library facilities and Book exhibitions were also organised from time to time to encourage reading habit among the students.

LCD is also displayed in the library where recent activities of the library, new arrivals and current affairs are exhibited regularly.

The library has also got institutional membership of National Digital Library of India (NDLI) for all faculty members and students. NDLI is the platform for all the learners with educational materials from primary to postgraduate levels including multiple subject domains.

The alumni desk is also in the library where our ex-students get themselves registered as alumnus. This year 1078 students registered themselves as college alumnus.

Library blog is also maintained as “PGGCG11LIBRARY” where library activities are uploaded and updated regularly. Library blog also provides access to the open resources via providing links.

Library is also on the way to purchase Anti Plagiarism software for the faculty, post graduate students and research scholars of the institution. Web-OPAC is also under consideration for

the users to provide the library service 24*7 over the internet by which one can check the availability of the books in the library.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE

Abha, the college magazine, showcases in pictorial form the achievements of the college and also provides a forum for the students to express their creativity on a wide range of issues in English, Hindi and Punjabi.

YOUTH FESTIVAL

Our students gave sterling performances at the annual Panjab University Youth and Heritage festival. It was held from **24th-27th September 2019**, at the Post Graduate Government College for Girls, Sector 42, Chandigarh. The students bagged top positions in virtually all the categories. We also got the running trophy for the **seventh** consecutive year. (See Annexure V)

ORIENTATION ASSEMBLY

To acquaint new students with the college environment an orientation assembly is organised at the start of every academic session. The Principal, Prof. (Dr.) Anita Kaushal welcomes the students and highlights the curricular and co-curricular aspects as well as the rules and regulations of the college. Information is also imparted regarding time-tables, exams, college societies, library and scholarships available, so that the transition from school to college is smooth. This year the orientation was held on **10th August, 2019**.

TUTORIAL MEET

Tutorial meets are organised twice a month on alternative Saturdays. Each tutor is assigned 25-35 students to familiarise them with the general discipline, rules and regulations. The students are also apprised of the Prevention of Ragging Committee and Sexual Harassment Complaint Centre. Different causes of Anaemia were highlighted by our alumnus student Ms. Jaini Thaper. She elaborated different types of Anaemia prevalent among the girls due to unbalanced diet, carbonated drinks, pesticides, oxytocin, genetic and lack of vitamins among the diet. The programme was organized under POSHAN MAH celebration. About 100 students attended the lecture, out of which 15 students participated in extempore organized on various topics related to anaemia and best three students were awarded.
- **“Breast Cancer Awareness Programme”** was organized on 7th November 2019. About 120 students attended the lecture cum awareness programme. Dr. Japnit Singh from Ivy Hospital Mohali elaborated various causes of breast cancer among various age groups of females. She explained how with the help of ultrasound, mammography and self assessment one can do cancer screening. With the help of dummy she explained how self examination of breast can be performed with circular and wedge techniques. It is very important to catch the cancer at earlier stage before it catches you. The talk was very informative and enlightening for the students and their parents, as well as the faculty members .
- A lecture on „**Cancer awareness**“ was organised on 28th January 2020. **Dr. Rupinder Kaur (MBBS, MS -Consultant, Gynaecologist, IVY Hospital)** sensitized the students particularly about Cervical and Breast Cancer in females. The aim was to raise cancer awareness regarding detection, prevention and treatment. She stressed on various signs and symptoms for early detection of these cancers and the need of change in life style habits. The Electoral Literacy Club of the college organised an expert talk on National Voter's Service Portal on 28th September 2019. Team of experts from the Election Department, Chandigarh Administration addressed the students and faculty on the occasion.

A detailed description of National Voter's Service Portal (NVSP) was provided to the students about the initiative. It was highlighted that this step would link the voter to the portal and one would be able to have access to his/her particulars and would also be in a position to change the individual details whenever needed. A demonstration of the portal was also given by the officials so that the students become aware of the mechanism.

They also briefed about the Electors Verification Programme (EVP) whereby the voters can create an account by registration and verify the individual details. This way the particulars can be kept safe; and in case anybody else tries to change the particulars, the respective voter would receive a message/email. They also carried out a live demonstration wherein students also downloaded the app on their mobiles. The officials guided the students about the app and told them the procedure of handling it in future.

150TH BIRTH ANNIVERSARY OF MAHATMA GANDHI

Prashasnika, organised an Essay Writing Competition. The Competition was organised to mark the 150th Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. The competition was open to all classes of all streams. A Quiz on National Unity was organised wherein the students were asked questions on the genesis, composition and content of Constitution of India. Questions were also related to Indian polity and history, and the spirit of nationalism. The students showed great enthusiasm and participated actively in the quiz.

The grant will help in the establishment of new laboratories for existing programmes and new programmes, both for the UG and PG level classes, new classrooms and support units etc.
