

#### **International Webinar**

Under the able guidance of Principal Prof. Anita Kaushal, an International Webinar was organized by Department of Zoology and Community Hygiene and Public Health Society, PGGCG-11, Chandigarh on **12<sup>th</sup> November**, **2021**. Prof. (Dr.) Ravinder Anand-, Associate Professor in Reproductive physiology and Endocrinology in the school of Biosciences at the University of Nottingham (UK) was the speaker. She delivered a lecture on topic 'Discovering the Pied-Piper of steroid hormones in females.' She mentors about 300 research scholars in the University. She has received 05 Young Scientist awards. She has also won the outstanding research supervisor of the year 2021 of University of Nottingham. She emphasised her lecture on the molecular physiological mechanisms of female and male reproductive systems and the signalling mechanisms in the reproductive system, including the gametes and differentiation processes. Her lecture was very informative and research based. Around 100 post-graduate and undergraduate students participated enthusiastically in the webinar. The session ended with a long interactive session where the students asked their queries regarding the research and opportunities for studies abroad.

## Invited talk on Women's Reproductive Health

Under the able guidance of Principal Prof. Anita Kaushal, a lecture was organized by Community Hygiene and Public Health society and Department of Zoology, PGGCG-11, Chandigarh on the topic "Women's Reproductive Health : Facts and Fancies" on 1<sup>st</sup> **December, 2021**. The invited speaker Dr. Tejinder Kaur, MBBS, DNB (Obs. and Gynae.) Empanelled Consultant Laparoscopic Surgeon & Infertility Specialist, Fortis Medicentre, Chandigarh, sensitized the students and faculty members about reproductive cycle, Cervix cancer and the associated medications required for preventing the diseases related to reproductive system in females. About 70 students of both post graduate and graduate classes attended the lecture and interacted with the speaker to discuss their problems related to reproductive health.



#### **Invited Talk on World Cancer Day**

Under the able guidance of Principal Prof. Anita Kaushal, an invited talk was organized by Community Hygiene & Public Health Society and Department of Zoology, PGGCG-11, Chandigarh to mark World Cancer Day on **4<sup>th</sup> February**, **2022**. Dr. Narendra Kumar Bhalla, Director, Radiation Oncology, Fortis Hospital, Mohali, was the guest speaker. Dr. Narendra Kumar has an experience of 20 years as a radiation oncologist in treating and management of different types of cancer. He emphasised his lecture with a theme to judge breast cancer so as to inspire and build global awareness about breast cancer signs, symptoms, diagnosis and treatment. His lecture sensitized the students about the need to prevent millions of deaths each year by raising awareness and education about cancer. Around 90 post-graduate and undergraduate students participated enthusiastically in the webinar.

#### **Invited Talk and Dental Check Up**

Under the able guidance of Principal Ma'am Prof. (Dr.) Anita Kaushal, Community Hygiene and Public Health Society and Department of Zoology of Post Graduate Govt. College for Girls, Sector-11, Chandigarh organized a talk and dental check-up for students, teaching staff and non-teaching staff on 16<sup>th</sup> March, 2022. Dr. Shivani Gupta introduced the speaker for the event; Dr. Ravi Kumar, (Dentist, Periodontist, Implantologist), Vital Dental, Sector- 15, Chandigarh. Dr. Kumar gave an elaborated talk covering the entire concept related to oral hygiene which included importance of dietary habits, regular dental check-ups and issues related to tooth decaying along with its various treatments. He also interacted with students of B.Sc. (Medical) and M.Sc. (Zoology) and satisfied their various queries related to oral hygiene. The talk was followed by dental check-up conducted by team of Vital Dental. As many as 100 participants including teaching staff of Department of Zoology, non-teaching staff and students were examined. The team then provided their report/ comments on general oral hygiene of students. According to which the general oral hygiene of our students was found to be good. Dr. Umesh Bharti, Head, Department of Zoology gave away the vote of thanks. She highlighted the significance of such event/ interactions for students as well as for teaching and non-teaching staff.





## Awareness about Poly Cystic Ovarian Disease (PCOD): A Preliminary Survey

Under the able guidance of Principal, Prof. (Dr) Anita Kaushal, Community Hygiene and Public Health Society, PGGCG 11 conducted a survey to analyse the awareness about Poly Cystic Ovarian Disease (PCOD) on **10<sup>th</sup> April, 2022**. Polycystic ovary syndrome (PCODS) is **a** hormonal disorder common among women of reproductive age. Women with PCOS may have infrequent or prolonged menstrual periods or excess male hormone (androgen) levels. The ovaries may develop numerous small collections of fluid (follicles) and fail to regularly release eggs. The survey included students from all the streams (B.A., B.Sc., B.Com, M.A. and MSc.) of the college. In total 329 responses were received. In the survey it was observed that 88.8% students knew about POCD and 11.2% were unaware about this problem as shown in the figure 1.

8% of the students admitted that they are suffering from this problem while 0.3% suffered from acne problem and 0.3% suffered from irregular periods which are the important symptoms of PCOD as shown in figure 2. 76% of the college students were aware about the symptoms, causes and cure of PCOD but 24% are still not familiar with the problem. 73.3% students wanted to attend the counselling session on PCOD as shown in figure 3. After this survey it was decided that Community Hygiene and Public Health Society must organize an interactive session with concerned doctors to spread awareness among students regarding PCOD.



#### **Extempore on World No Tobacco Day**

Community Hygiene and Public Health Society and Department of Zoology organized an extempore on World Anti – Tobacco day, an annual awareness campaign started by WHO on  $31^{st}$  May, 2022. The celebration was aimed to sensitize public on the dangers of using tobacco and the business practices of tobacco companies. An extempore was compiled in the form an audio-visual where around 20 students participated. The students highlighted different efforts being made to fight the tobacco epidemic, and what people can do to live a healthy life so as to protect future generations. The purpose of the activity was to draw global attention to the tobacco misuse and various preventable measures that can be taken to defeat death and the disease itself permanently.

## E-poster making on World Sickle Cell Awareness Day



Medical prepared the posters to increase public knowledge and an understanding of sickle cell disease, and the challenges experienced by patients and their families and caregivers. The students highlighted symptoms, causes and various treatments available worldwide to spread the information and resources of emergency departmental care units for people suffering with sickle cell disease.

#### **E-poster making on Genetic Disorder Awareness**

Community Hygiene & Public Health Society and Department of zoology organized E-poster making activity to spread awareness on Genetic disorders on **30<sup>th</sup> June**, **2022**. The aim of the activity was to educate about need genetic disorders. Around 20 students of B.Sc. Medical participated and prepared e- posters. Students discussed the causes, symptoms and diagnosis of various genetic disorders like phenylketonuria, alkaptonuria, albinism, sickle cell anaemia, tyrosinemia, taysach disease etc to raise awareness for the people worldwide affected by these rare diseases. The students highlighted the need for spreading awareness in rural areas to prevent these issues, diagnostic methods, and other aspects of treatment. Also it was focused to enlighten academicians and researchers on recent techniques developed in prenatal diagnosis for screening of these genetic disorders prevailing in the society.
