A Workshop on the ‘Basics of Photography’

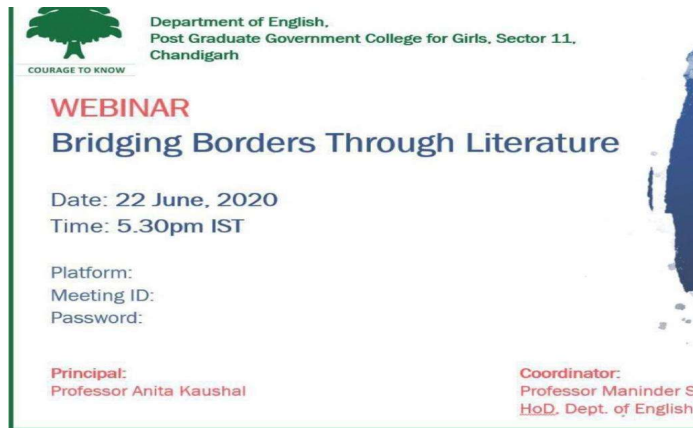
