- The cleanliness committee was also instructed to take regular rounds in order to ensure the cleanliness of the campus.
- To address the issue regarding the need for more fans in classrooms and improvement in infrastructure the caretaker was asked to take requisition from concerned departments and check the credibility of these requirements and take necessary action.
- To ensure the availability of clean drinking water, caretaker of the college was directed to arrange servicing of water purifier systems of water coolers.

- For better laboratory apparatus the concerned departments were conveyed.
- Timetable in-charge was forwarded the requirement for separate room requested by the students of MA vocal students.
- The need to improve the Wi-Fi and over all infrastructure was taken into account for future action.

The committee is focused to ensure that there is no insecure and hostile learning environment which discourages women's participation in College, thereby adversely affecting their social and economic empowerment and the goal of inclusive growth. Following are the objectives of the committee:

- To ensure that all the provisions in the Sexual Harassment of Women at Work Place (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 (POSH Act) legislations are adhered to in order to protect women employees and students from any act of sexual harassment in the campus.
- To comply with the directives of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India requiring all employers to develop and implement a policy for prevention of sexual harassment at the college.
- To evolve a permanent mechanism for the prevention and redressal of sexual harassment cases and other acts of gender based violence at the College.
- To follow and lay down guidelines for redressal of complaint related to sexual harassment of women at the College.
- To create awareness about gender equity.

3. Procedure/Mechanism for Lodging Complaint:

As per the guidelines of the Act, the committee has formulated the procedure for lodging the complaints:

- An aggrieved person is required to submit a written complaint to the Prevention of Sexual Harassment of Women, Women Cell and Legal Awareness Committee within three months from the date of the incident. Provided that where such a complaint cannot be made in writing, the Chairperson or any member of the committee shall render all reasonable assistance to the person for making the complaint in writing or can email the complaint to the college email address: principal_gcg@yahoo.co.in.
- The committee members investigate the cases and act upon the cases which have been forwarded along with the necessary documents /proof, if any
- The committee assures that the grievance has been properly addressed to and solved in a stipulated time limit.

4. Functions:

The committee is empowered to look into the matters of harassment which includes the following functions:

- A student with a grievance may approach the committee members and file a written complaint in person or via email.
- The cases will be attended promptly on receipt of written grievances from the students.
- The committee will review all cases and act as per rules.
- The committee will prepare and maintain record of all the complaints and action taken.

5. Activities :

Even before the provisions of Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 came into force, our college has been putting efforts zestfully in spreading awareness about the very cause among our young girl students, keeping in mind their safety at utmost priority.

The college authorities send suggestions to Chandigarh Police to check eve teasing, as a result of which following actions have been taken by the Police-

- The Policewomen (in uniform and plain clothes) are deputed outside the college.
- The Police patrolling around the college during late hours has increased to ensure the better safety of the girl students.
- The martial arts students of the college conduct self-defense demonstrations from time to time for the students to learn martial arts, which will be helpful to them in troublesome situations.
- The helpline numbers are also displayed in the college campus so that the police can be contacted immediately in case of eve teasing.




Talk on Prevention of Sexual Harassment by Prof Nirupma Luthra



In the beginning, 'ragging' was an amusing practice. It has degenerated into an evil. It has become a synonym for 'torture'. It should be banned. The supreme court of India has defined it as. "Any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken, or written or by act which adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student is an act of ragging." But if through ragging the decency and morals are violated, one's body gets injured, then ragging becomes a legal offence. For such cases, there are certain punishments in UGC's anti-ragging guidelines which includes a fine up to Rs. 25,000, cancellation of admission, with holding scholarship, debarring from appearing for exams, suspension or expulsion from hostel ad rustication from a period of one to four semesters.

In pursuance of the judgement of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 8.5.2009 in Civil Appeal No. 887/2002, strictly banning ragging in Educational Institutions, the UGC notified "Regulations of Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009". As per the UGC Regulation on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions (Third Amendment), 2016, ragging has been strictly banned in Educational Institutions. In this connection Post Graduate Govt. College for Girls, Sector-11, Chandigarh strictly follows the guidelines of UGC as per the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India orders to stop Ragging in the College.



Introduction:

As per the UGC Letter No. F-1-8/2006(CPP-II) dated 16th May 2008 and 2nd July 2008 addressed to the Registrar, Panjab University, Chandigarh, Hon'ble Supreme Court of India has strictly banned ragging in Educational Institutions. In this connection Post Graduate Govt. College for Girls, Sector-11, Chandigarh strictly follows the guidelines of UGC as per the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India orders to stop Ragging in the College.

With reference to the Ministry of Education communication D.O. No. 1-15/2009 (ARC) pt. III dated 23rd December 2021, regarding the implementation of preventive measures in the educational institutions, Post Graduate Govt. College for Girls, Sector - 11 Chandigarh is adopting the following effective steps for prevention of Ragging in our institution:

- 1. Anti-Ragging Undertaking– As per the notification and instructions from the Govt., an undertaking to not indulge in any sort of Ragging is taken at the time of admissions from all the students taking admission to the college. These affirmations in itself help the institution to make it ragging free by putting the onus of responsibility on the students, since they took the pledge of not getting involved in any ragging related activity in the college.
- 2. Anti-Ragging Committee The college has an anti-ragging committee to address the issue of ragging. The college administration along with Anti-Ragging Committee Members gives briefing about the menace of ragging during BA-I Orientation Counselling sessions which was held on 30th August in this year. The college includes awareness of Anti Ragging as a part of value-based curriculum.

- 3. CCTV Cameras CCTV cameras have been installed throughout the College Campus with monitoring facilities in the office of College Principle and the Dean.
