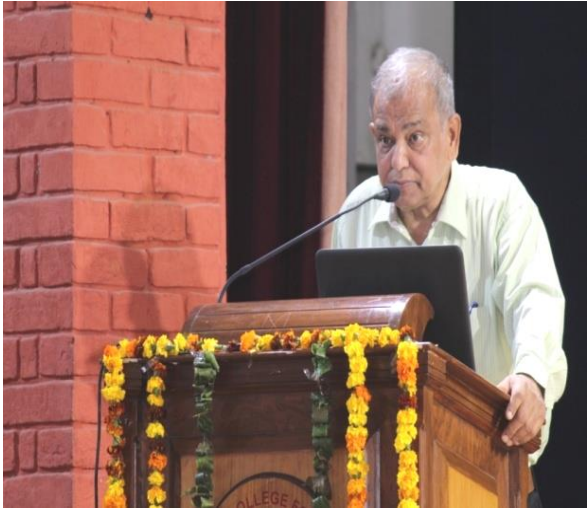

VI: Report on Alumni Meet

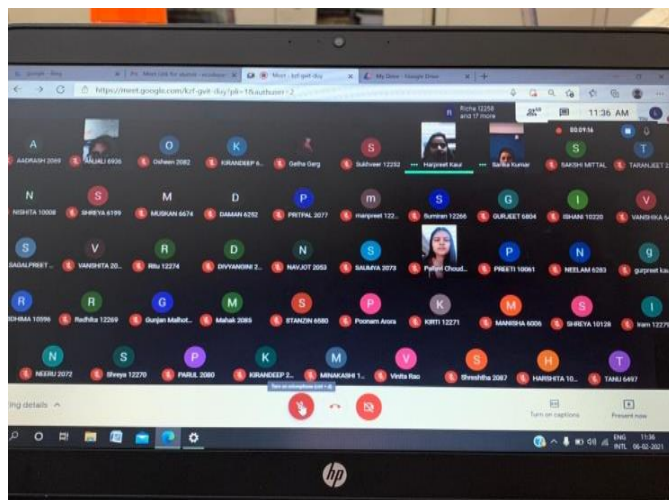

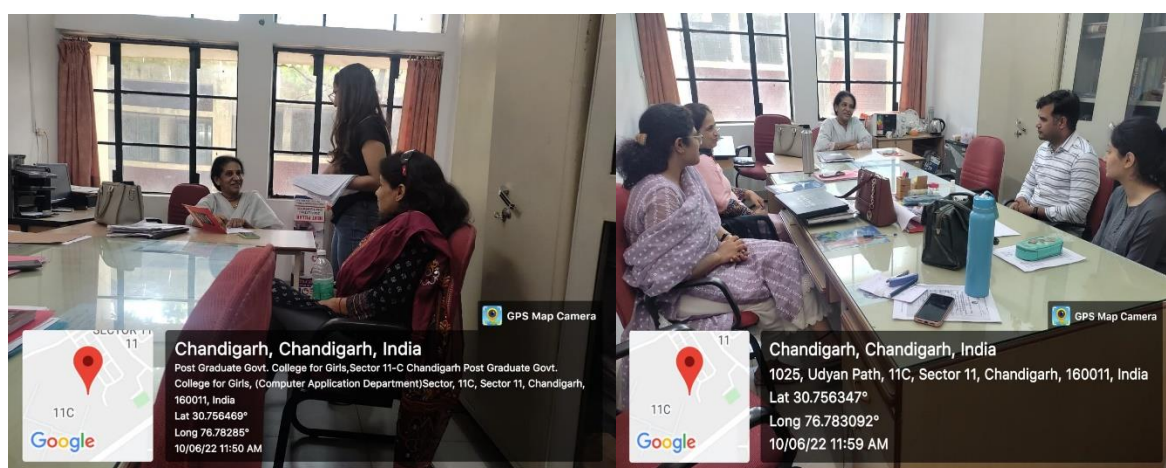

X: Expert talk on “An Early Initiation Into Investment: The D-MAT Way”

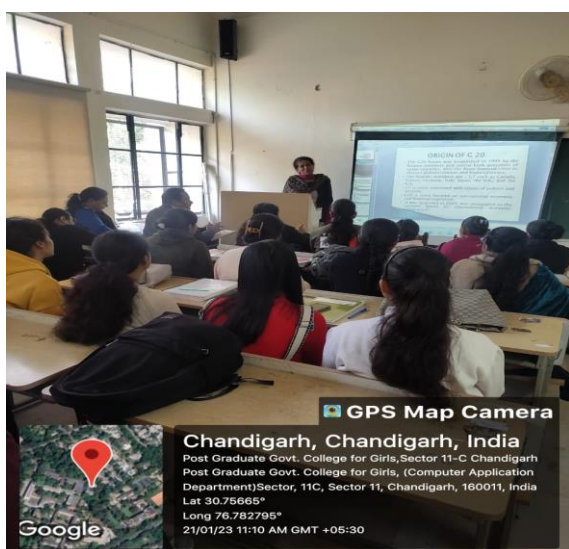

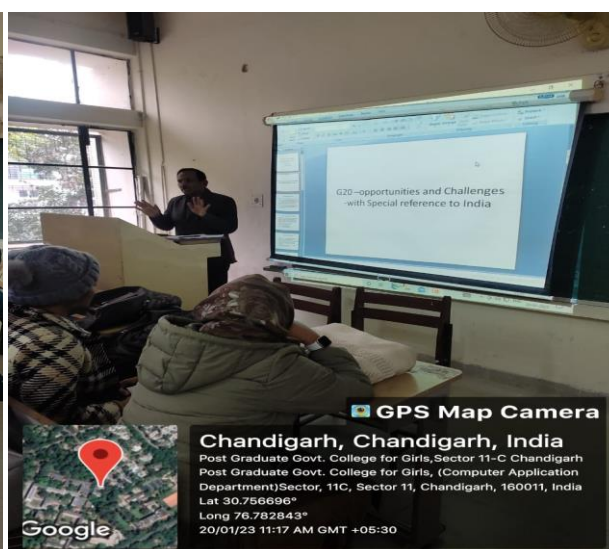

Subject: Grant of affiliation for M.A. I (Economics and Public Administration) w.e.f. 2001-02 to Govt. College for Girls, Sector 11, Chandigarh.

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The Inspection Committee inspected the college at 10.00 a.m. on 22.3.2001. The Convener placed before the committee and the Principal a copy of the P.U. ^{Cal.} Vol. III, 1996, pages 168-69, which includes the provisions for grant of affiliation to colleges for M.A. classes. A copy of the same was handed over to the Principal of the college. With reference to these provisions, particularly clauses (iv) & (v) on page 168, and on the basis of the information supplied by the Principal, the committee recommends as follows:

a) Affiliation for M.A. II in Economics:

The committee recommends that the affiliation for this subject be granted w.e.f. the session 2001-02, in view of the following facts:

- i) The senior most teacher in Economics fulfills the qualifications and grade laid down by the university for a position of a Reader.
- ii) The number of regular teachers duly qualified is six where-as the Cal. requires four.
- iii) The stock of books for the purpose seems to be reasonable at present. However, in pursuance of clause (v) on page 168 of the said Cal., the committee recommends that additional books be purchased in consultation with the Chairman of the Department of Economics, Panjab University, Chandigarh.

In view of the fact that posts in the Govt. Colleges are transferable, the committee stipulates that the qualifications as well as the number of the teachers in Economics be always maintained as per the requirements laid down in the P.U. Calendar.

b) Affiliation for M.A. I in Public Administration:

On the basis of the information supplied by the Principal, the committee noticed the following deficiencies as per P.U. Cal.:

- i) The senior most teacher in the subject does not fulfill the provision of grade and qualifications for the post of a Reader. In fact, none of the teachers fulfills these requirements.
- ii) The number of confirmed teachers in the college at present is only two as against the Cal. requirement of four teachers for M.A. programme.

The committee pointed out these deficiencies to the Principal. The Principal assured the committee that the requirement of staff as stipulated in the P.U. Calendar will be met within a time period of one month by getting suitable teachers in
