





A Visit to a Art Exhibition of Shirely Siegal an artist from Israel and Mr. Madanlal at Fine Art

Gallery, Panjab University, sec 14 Chandigarh.

Our students have also attended a Talk on Contemporary art by Siegal, from Israel delivered at Art history department, Panjab University.

Interview with Shirley Siegal, an artist, professor and art historian from Israel, by Meenal Thakur, an MA Fine Arts student held at Panjab University, Chandigarh.

1) Me:- How did you get the idea of creating this art?

1) Shirley: - Well I've been dealing with issues of status of women worldwide for a long time and then I met a women artist from Iran in New York. Iran and Israel are not friends as you know (true enemies) and I find a conversation is impossible with most of them, that is why I am going there to talk. There was an artist called Judy Chicago. She is an American feminist artist, she created a very big art work called the dinner party. I suggest that you go and look for what I'm talking about. She created 39 elaborate place settings arranged along a triangular table and she invited to this all the historical famous women famous women. When I read this I said okay now I have the solution we will create a dinner table and bring the women of middle east together and we will create it from a women's point of view because we have tried a man's point of view did it work? No so that's why a women's point of view and I am confident that it will bring a change.

2) Me- How is art powerful? How has it got an ability to change the society?

2) Shirley:-Wow Big question! what you're basically asking is that can art change the world? It can actually the ability of art is not to go into the mind but to go into the stomach. Art is all

about feeling and when you feel you actually take information and process it in a different way, not going to the mind but into your senses and it will impact you in a different way and you remember the information in a different way and usually what it does, because the feelings are so strong, it sometimes leads you to action. It leads you to do something about something that really disturbs you, so it is a very motivating thing.

3) Me- From how long have you been practicing art?

3) Shirley:-I've been painting most of my life but professionally after my third son was born at the age of 35, I think something happens to a women at the age of 35 you're not there yet I know (giggles) but at the age of 35 it's like a turning point because you've gone through enough time and enough things in your life you look back and you say what have I done till now? and you're at the verge of being young and being not so young and you start thinking 'ok what next?' and that's when it changed and I decided to be a professional artist because I was not happy with what I was doing.

4) Me- how do you see your journey as an artist like your themes, your techniques and everything? Has there been a development?

4) Shirley:-It is a journey and yes there is development in the process. You start your journey and you don't know where you will end up. So much is changing I thought at the beginning that I will just draw and paint and then I started working on still life and then I was bored and then I tried to paint landscape. And I did it for a whole year and then there was an exhibition in London it was nice but I wasn't on fire. And I said 'what's missing? What's wrong? I'm missing something' and then there came an issue of the women and suddenly I knew this is my calling. I have to deal with something that is inside me.

5) Me - Whose you favourite artist? Is there someone who has inspired you?

5) Shirley: - Many, Michelangelo is my number one. I look at his drawings especially the way he draws his hands, you can't stop looking at them or the toes, every part of the body is just amazing. I love Michelangelo, I would marry him if he was here today but he was gay (giggles). Caravaggio was also a huge influence.

6) Me -Will you continue this?

- **6) Shirley**:- For the rest of my life.
- 7) Me- You've taken portrait as a medium to present your work. Why did you choose only portrait and not any other mode?

7) Shirley: Because they (portraits) stop people, because people walk in and they stop when they look at them and they feel like they are standing in front of a real person and that's powerful. And especially the eyes because when you look someone in the eyes you can see their soul. You feel like you are talking to this person. If I would use anything else like landscape, it would not have created the same effect. It wouldn't have been the same effect. These women are talking to you, so that's why and yes Michelangelo of course (as mentioned before his treatment of the human body has impressed me).




