Date: 12th Oct , 2022, In Campus Activity, 50 students

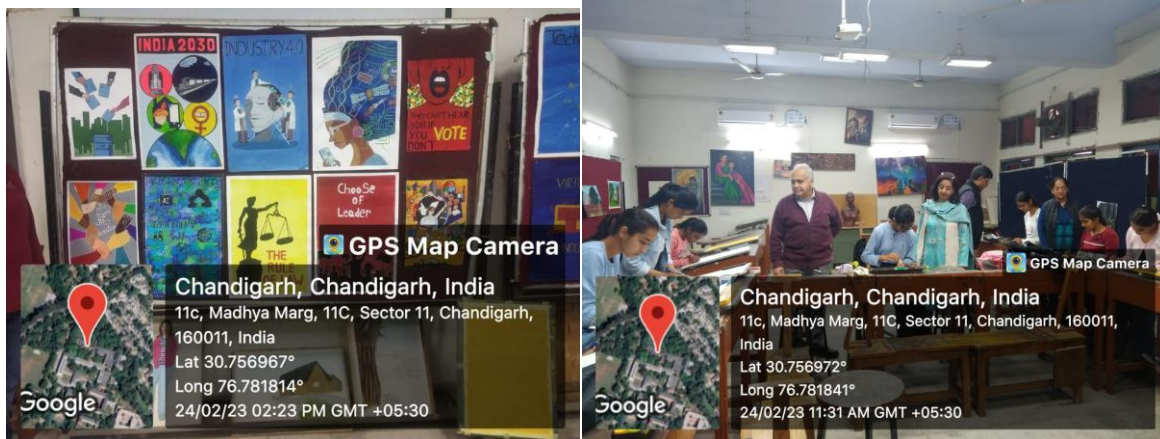

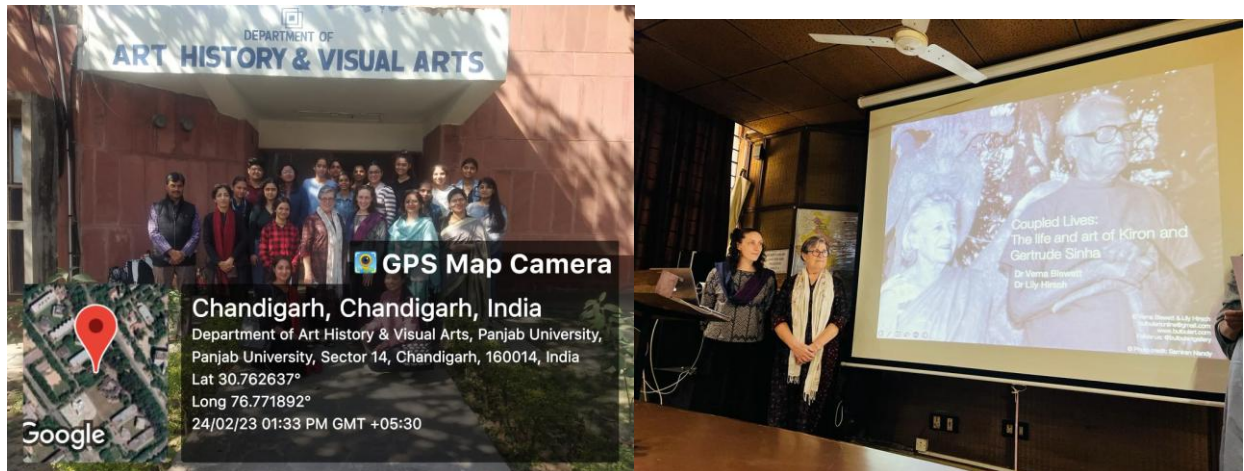
5. Activity: Off Campus

Date: 6th April 23, Venue: Govt. College of Art, Sec-10, Chandigarh, 25 students

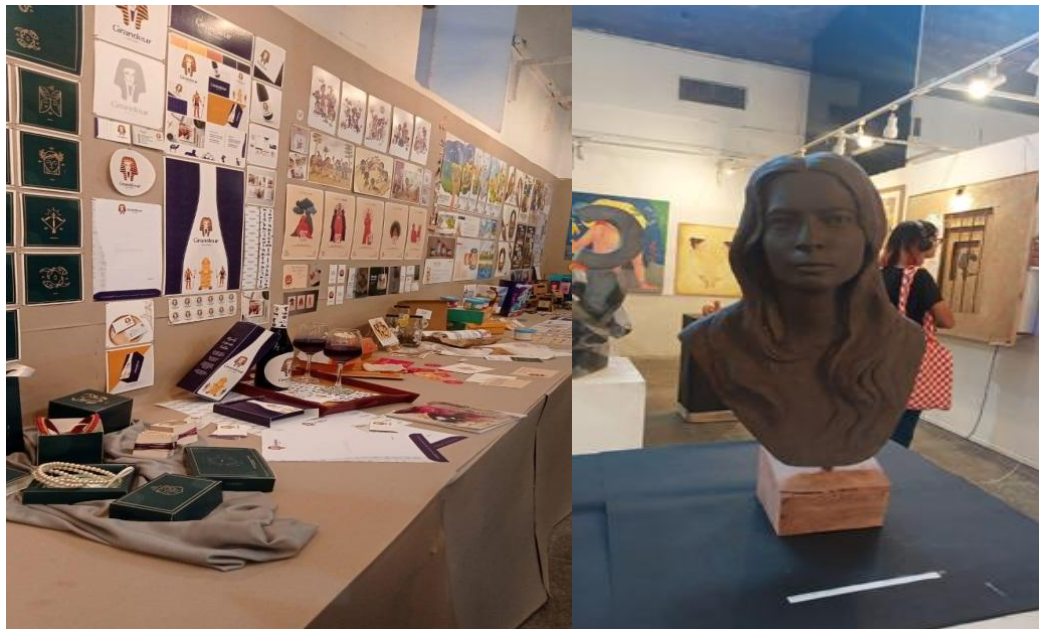
REPORT
