

Raghava Reddy, Professor and Head, Department of Sociology, Central University of Hyderabad was the guest speaker. Forty one students and the faculty members from the college participated in the event. He emphasised on the evolution of Rural Sociology in India.



Lecture on the Functioning of Institute of Social Science Trust

Institute of Social Science Trust (ISST), New Delhi is a not-for-profit, non-government organization, registered as a Public Charitable Trust since 1980. Team from the ISST comprising Dr. Jahnvi Andharia, Director ISST, Ms. Saee Pawar and Ms. Ashmeet Kaur Bilkhu, Research Consultants visited PGGCG-11 on **23rd September 2022**. They apprised the participants about the functioning of trust and the research work undertaken by ISST over the years.

Their presentation was focused on the key area of ISST i.e. to bridge the gap between research, action, and policy debate, especially on issues concerning women, children, and other marginalized communities through a gender transformative approach. Dr. Andharia also shared that presently ISST is engaged in a range of macro and micro-level research including a range of community development programs directed toward the social and economic empowerment of women, adolescents, and children. There were 46 participants comprising undergraduate and postgraduate students and faculty members from the department of Sociology and allied disciplines. The participants were actively engaged in the talk. Team ISST also engaged the students in their ongoing research project through focus group discussion.
