Introduction


Har Ghar Tiranga

The selection was done on the basis that how a cadet can represent themselves as well as the team he/she is leading because a leader is not only one who can speak on behalf of others but instead one who has some good qualities to realize everyone's problem and to provide them a satisfactory result.

Cadet Dimpy from our college got selected for this leadership camp. There were as usual vacancies for Chandigarh Group. The requirement was for 6 (senior wing) cadets. 4 SWs from the Army wing and one from each Navy Wing and Air Force Wing nailed the camp.
