VIGILANCE AWARENESS WEEK (30.10.2023 to 5.11.2023) 'Say No To Corruption: Commit To the Nation'

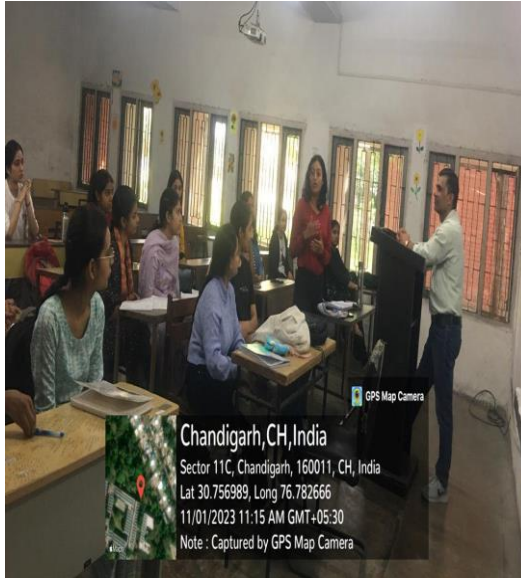
Integrity Pledge (31.10.2023)

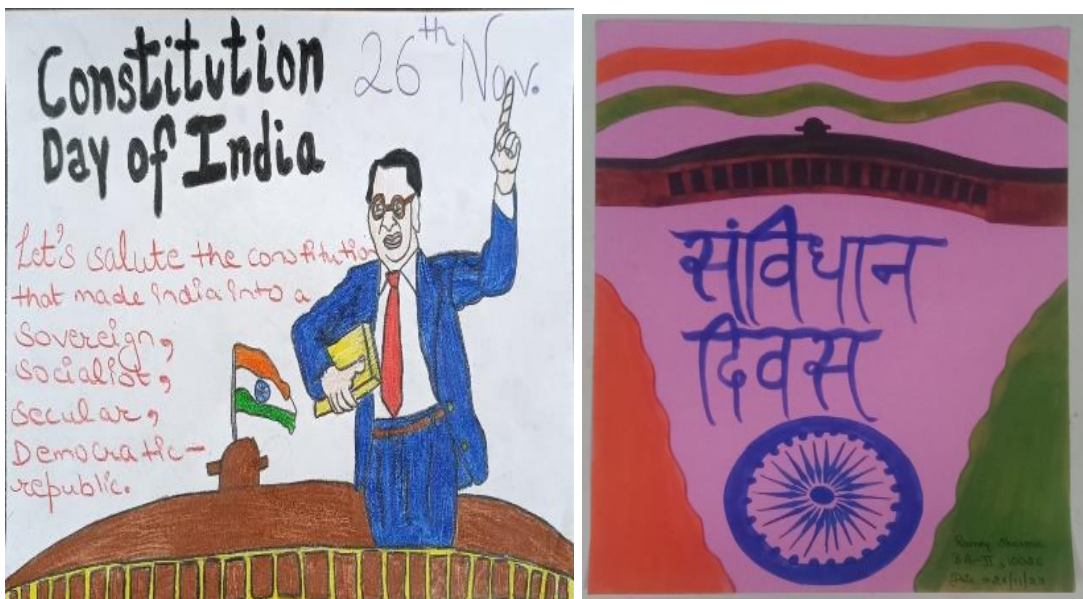
Human Chain (04.11.2023)
