Anti-Ragging Committee Report
2024-2025

As per the UGC Letter No. F-1-8/2006(CPP-II) dated 16th May 2008 and 2nd July 2008 addressed to the Registrar, Panjab University, Chandigarh, Hon'ble Supreme Court of India has strictly banned ragging in Educational Institutions. In this connection Post Graduate Govt. College for Girls, Sector-11, Chandigarh strictly follows the guidelines of UGC as per the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India orders to stop Ragging in the College. With reference to the Ministry of Education's communications D.O. No. 1-15/2009 (ARC) pt. III dated 23rd December 2021 and D.O.No. 1-15/2009 (ARC) pt. III dated December, 14, 2023/23 (regarding the implementation of preventive measures in the educational institutions), Post Graduate Govt. College for Girls, Sector – 11, Chandigarh has adopted a strict mechanism to curb the issue of ragging.

Anti-Ragging Committee: The college has an anti-ragging committee/cell to address the issue of ragging. Following are presently the members of the committee:

The college administration along with Anti-Ragging Committee Members gives briefing about the menace of ragging during Orientation / Counselling sessions held at the beginning of every session.


Anti – Ragging Undertaking: As per the mandate of the Government of India, all the students admitted in ongoing classes are required to submit an Anti- Ragging Undertaking given at the anti-ragging web portal of the Government of India (www.antiragging.in/www.amanmoverment.org). In their admission forms, students have to fill the reference number of Anti-Ragging Undertaking in the place provided in the admission form. This information is shared in the college prospectus.

Installation of CCTV cameras:

CCTV cameras have been installed throughout the College Campus with monitoring facilities in the office. These cameras help in keeping round the clock check on the activities of the students and help


guard against any anti-social /criminal activities with special emphasis on any attempt at ragging of the students.

Awareness through Talks, Workshops & Posters – The College conducts talks and workshops presentations at the time of tutorials for the students of our College so that they get all the information about ragging and anti-ragging law, preventive measures in the college and are introduced with the member of Anti Ragging Committee. Helpline numbers are displayed on the notice boards of the colleges and the hostels. Any student can inform to the committee about ragging. E-posters & Hoardings – Hoardings of Anti-Ragging are placed at different parts of the college from Admission time till End of the Session. E-posters and videos (https://www.ugc.ac.in/Ragging_video.aspx) of Anti-Ragging from UGC website are shared to the college students through various online groups and are also displayed at prominent places in the various wings of the College Campus and Notice Boards.



NSS Camps – The College also organizes NSS Camps every year and also conveys the message of Anti-ragging in the Educational Institution. Students participating in NSS Camp spread the message of Anti- Ragging through banners, nukkad naataks, seminars and poster making competitions.

Anti-Ragging Website: The College is also registered with Anti-Ragging website of UGC – www.antiragging.in, hence any student can register a complaint, if any, directly on this website and bring the same to the notice of central authorities. Additionally, Information about anti ragging website and helpline is shared on college website, and also through posters displayed in the college.




Activities conducted in the session 2024-2045


Anti-Ragging Awareness Talk

Anti-Ragging Awareness Talk was conducted by Dr. Ritu Sekri, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Psychology, P.G.G.C.G - 11, Chandigarh on 12th Aug, 2024





The event aimed to educate students about the adverse effects of ragging, the legal implications, and the psychological impact of ragging. Around 90 students from different streams attended the talk. Dr. Ritu began the session by defining ragging and explaining how it can manifest in various forms, ranging from verbal abuse to physical violence. She emphasized that ragging is not only a punishable offence but also a violation of human rights that can have long-lasting effects on the mental health of individuals. She shared real-life examples of ragging incidents that led to severe psychological damage and, in some cases, even suicides. Dr. Ritu highlighted the importance of empathy and understanding in fostering a supportive environment where every student feels safe and respected.

The talk also covered the legal aspects of ragging, detailing the laws in place to prevent it. Dr. Ritu informed the students about the Anti-Ragging Helpline and encouraged them to report any incidents of ragging without fear of retaliation.



Screening of Videos

Videos downloaded from the U.G.C anti-ragging portal were screened on 14th Aug, 2024, followed with the discussions. These videos effectively conveyed the severe consequences and psychological impacts of ragging, helping to instill a sense of empathy and responsibility among students. This activity created awareness about the anti-ragging laws prevalent in India.



Poster Making and Slogan Writing Competition

On 16th Aug, 2024 poster making and slogan writing competitions on the theme Anti Ragging under the aegis of UGC's #YaARIYouthAgainstRagging Contest were held. Nearly 50 students from different classes and streams enthusiastically participated in these competitions and the following prize winners were awarded on 17th Aug, 2024
