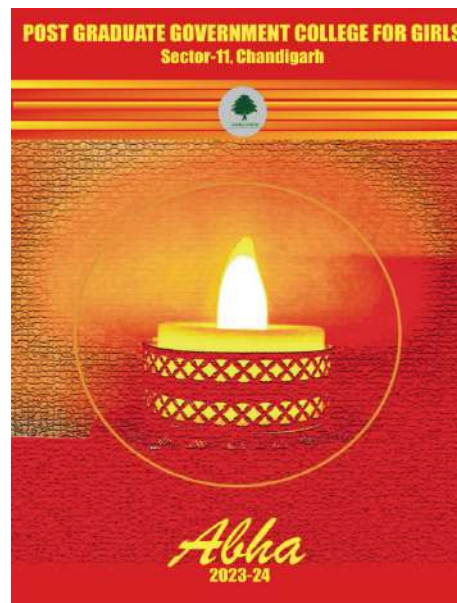


Holistic Development

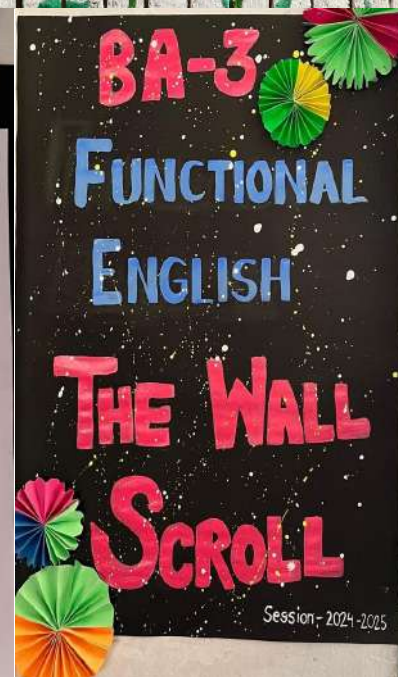
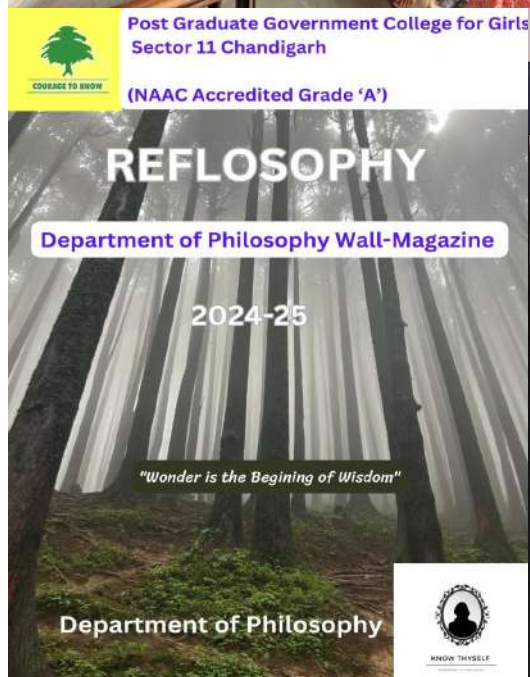

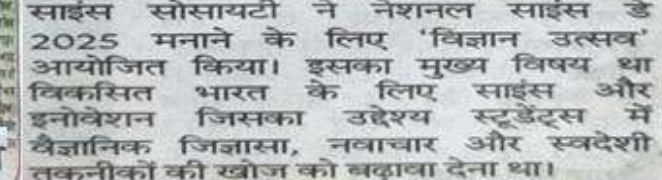

All foreign students shall obtain Eligibility Certificate from Deputy Registrar (General) Panjab University, in all cases and the admission of the foreign students College /Teaching Departments would be governed by the guidelines issued by the Dean ,Foreign Students. The eligibility form should be accompanied by forwarding letter from the Principal of the college/ Chairperson of the Teaching Department indicating the reason for denying the admission to the candidate. After obtaining the Eligibility Certificate, the candidate should submit the same to College/ Department where he/ she is seeking admission.

NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY (NEP)-2020

B.A.-I

The following shall be applicable to the applicants seeking admission in B.A. 1st Semester for the session 2025-26:

As per the guidelines of NEP 2020:

The undergraduate degree will have a flexible duration of either three or four years, with multiple exit options during this period. The table below outlines the various certifications a student can earn at different stages of their undergraduate study:

BA Degree programme will be of six semesters (three years).

- In the 1st semester, the student will be offered three subjects A, B and C. In addition, the student will be offered one MDC, one SEC, and one VAC. English (compulsory) will be studied under AEC.
- MDC should be such a subject which is
 - not one of the subjects offered by the student that is A, B or C, and
 - not offered by the student at +2 level.
- In the third semester, the student will select two subjects as Major and one as Minor.
- Once Major and Minor papers are chosen in 3rd semester, the same will continue as Major and Minor subject in the subsequent semesters.

BA Honours programme will be of eight semesters (four years).

- A student who secures 75% or more marks in aggregate till semester 6 (up to 3 year degree) shall be eligible for 4 Year Degree B.A. Honours with research, on the condition that the institution is a PU approved Research Centre

MDC-MULTI-DISCIPLINARY/IDC-INTER-DISCIPLINARY COURSE (3credits)

*Students are not allowed to choose or repeat courses (subjects) already undergone/studied at the higher secondary level (12th class). That is, MDC should be such a subject which is

- not one of the subjects offered by the student, say A, B or C, and
- not studied by the student at +2 level.

AEC- ABILITY ENHANCEMENT COURSE-ENGLISH COMPULSORY (2 credits)

VAC- VALUE ADDED COURSE (2 credits)

SEC- SKILL ENHANCEMENT COURSE (3 credits)

2. The student opting for Single Major must secure 50% credits of the total credits in the Major subject and obtain 24 credits from the Minor subject(s). To qualify for Minor in a particular subject, the student must attain atleast 12 credits in that subject(s).
3. A student who secures 75% or more marks in aggregate till semester 6 (up to 3 year degree) shall be eligible for 4 YEAR DEGREE B.A. HONOURS with research, on the condition that the Institution is a PU approved Research Centre
4. Once Major and Minor papers are chosen in 3rd semester, the same will continue as Major and Minor subject in the subsequent semesters.
5. The candidate opting for Honours in research is required to study a paper of Research Methodology (RM) of 04 credits and write Dissertation of 08 credits in one of the two Major subjects.

1. For procedure to apply online at DHE website www.dhe.chd.gov.in, refer to next page.
2. Applicants can apply for different Colleges with the same User id and Password. However, she will have to fill separate form for each college where she wishes to apply.
3. If the applicant wishes to apply for more than one course, she will have to fill in separate forms for each course.
4. Preparation and Display of Provisional Merit List.
 - I. The admission will be based on merit, which will be calculated on the basis of marks obtained in qualifying examination, fraction of marks less than the requisite percentage will not be rounded off to the advantage of the applicants i.e. 32.9%, 39.9% and 49.9% will not be rounded off to 33%, 40% and 50% respectively. In addition, weightage wherever applicable, will be given as per norms of Panjab University, Chandigarh.
 - II. In case of a tie at any stage in the preparation of the merit list, applicants securing equal marks will be bracketed together. Their inter-se-merit will be determined according to the following criteria. (Refer to Panjab University, Chandigarh, Handbook of Information 2025, Part-A, Page No. 41):
 - Applicant having higher percentage of marks in the qualifying examination shall rank higher in order of merit.
 - That if the marks are also same in the qualifying examination, then the applicant obtaining more marks in the immediate lower examination shall rank higher in order of merit.
 - That if two or more applicants secure equal marks in (i) and (ii) above, then the applicant older in age shall rank higher in order of merit.
 - III. The list of all the applicants who have applied online will be displayed course-wise on the DHE website www.dhe.chd.gov.in as well as on respective college website on **5th July, 2025 (Saturday) by 5:00 pm.**
 - IV. The applicants can report the discrepancies (if any) to the respective college through email provided by the college in their prospectus by **7th July, 2025 (Monday) by 5:00 pm.**
 - V. At the time of scrutiny of the form which begins from **8th July, 2025 (Tuesday)**, if any discrepancy is found regarding any information given/ documents uploaded, an SMS will be sent to the applicant on her registered mobile number. Applicant's form will be unlocked and she will be able to upload the additional document demanded on receiving the SMS regarding discrepancy, if any. The applicant has to rectify the discrepancy immediately otherwise she will be considered as an ineligible applicant.
 - VI. The provisional list of all eligible applicants will be displayed on the DHE website www.dhe.chd.gov.in as well as on the college website www.gcg11.ac.in on **12th July, 2025 (Saturday) by 5:00 pm.**
 - VII. If an applicant, having reserved category, falls under GENERAL CATEGORY in the merit list, the applicant will be given admission in the GENERAL CATEGORY only. So, the applicant must follow the admission schedule of General Category on the date and time specified under General Category.
 - VIII. The admissions under SPORTS Category will be done after the issuance of Graduation Certificate (whenever) by the Sports Department, Chandigarh Administration. The schedule for the same will be uploaded on DHE website www.dhe.chd.gov.in. However, the applicant has to choose the sports reservation while applying in online admission form.

5. Instruction page will be displayed, read the rules and regulations thoroughly then Click Next button and select the stream/course.
6. The application form will be displayed to the applicant. Applicants will have to fill details in various columns as required.
7. Applicant will fill lower examination details and finally submit the form.
8. Tick mark the reserved category, if any, and upload the valid supporting documents showing the name of the applicant. Certificates issued in the name of parents will not be valid. If the applicant has not tick marked any reserved category, she cannot claim the seat in that category at the time of admission. Applicants not selecting any Reservation will be considered under General Category.
9. The application form has separate columns for Mother's Name and Father's Name. Applicants should preferably mention names of both the parents. However, in case an applicant doesn't wish to declare the name of either the Mother or the Father, she may not be forced to do so and no applicant will be denied admission on this ground.

Hostel Guidelines and Rules

Hostel Guidelines

Students seeking admission to the hostel have to apply in advance as per instructions given below:

- Mere submission of application form does not ensure admission.
- Admission is strictly on merit and on the availability of seats.
- All students old and new seeking hostel accommodation are required to fill the hostel column as YES while filling the admission form online.
- Hostel seat is allotted for one academic year only.
- Admission will have to be sought afresh in every academic session.
- Under graduate students from the final year of various streams cannot reserve a seat for the Post Graduate courses.
- A seat can be denied to the old resident if her conduct, attendance and result of the mid semester and annual examinations have not been up to the mark.

Hostel Admission Regulations

1. Candidates will apply online at www.dhe.chd.gov.in.
2. Concealment of any kind of information at the time of admission will result into cancellation of their seat.
3. The students are required to report for college and hostel admission positively as per the Admission Schedule failing which they will lose their right to admission and hostel seat.
4. The admission to hostel is a 4-step process:
Step 1: College Admission Step 2: Hostel Admission Step 3: Payment of the fees
Step 4: Collection of Hostel Accommodation cum Pledge Form and Medical Fitness Certificate Proforma.
5. The hostel seats are limited therefore admission to the college does not ensure the right of the candidate to the hostel seat.
6. Physical presence of the candidate is compulsory on the day of reporting in the hostel.
7. Parents to note that admission formalities/process may take more than one day. So they are required to make their own arrangements of stay accordingly.
8. After the candidate has been granted admission in the college as well as in the hostel, she has to pay her college and hostel dues within 24 hours.
9. In case the candidate does not pay her fee within 24 hours, she loses claim to the hostel seat.
10. After the candidate has deposited the fees she will collect a 'Hostel Accommodation cum Pledge Form' and 'Medical Fitness Certificate Proforma' from the concerned hostel.
11. Admitted students will report to the hostel authorities in their allotted hostels one day before the commencement of the classes (Date to be notified on the college notice board).
12. The admitted student will bring the duly filled 'Hostel Accommodation cum Pledge Form' complete in all respects on the Reporting Day and submit it to the Hostel Superintendent in the hostel.



Hostel Guidelines and Rules

13. It is mandatory for all the new students and their PARENTS to be present on the Reporting Day, on which they will be acquainted with the hostel staff and apprised of the hostel rules and code of conduct.
14. Foreign students and students belonging to Manipur, Leh-Ladhak and Tibet etc. must have their parents accompanying them at time of hostel admission. They also need to submit an affidavit from their parents authorizing the local guardians to perform all responsibilities on their behalf regarding hostel rules and regulations. They are required to bring a family photograph and also two passport size photos at time of admission.
15. Rooms in the hostels are allotted by the hostel authorities only when the students report to them.

Hostel Rules

1. Mandatory Documents for Hostel Admission

Documents to be submitted during the time of joining the hostel

- Fee Receipts (College, Hostel and Mess)
- Hostel Accommodation cum pledge Form
- Medical Fitness Certificate issued only by a Government Hospital is mandatory
- Students are to be accompanied for admission in the hostel by Parents.
- Details of two married local guardians from different families in the tricity are required, with valid ID Proof for both.
- If any information provided by students or parents to hostel authorities is found to be false, strict action will be taken immediately by the hostel and college authorities.

2. Eligibility Criteria for Hostel Residency Rules regarding who can stay in the hostel

- Married students are not eligible for hostel accommodation
- If a student gets married during the session, she will be required to vacate the hostel immediately
- Day scholars are strictly not permitted to visit or stay in the hostel premises under any circumstances.

3. Personal belongings to be arranged by students

List of essential items Students must bring on their own

- Bedding, bed linen, and door curtains
- Locks, buckets, mugs, bulbs, dusters etc. (available at the college tuck shop if needed)
- Hostel students are not allowed to keep any personal vehicles.



Hostel Rules

4. Prohibition on Personal Electrical Appliances

- Hostel students are not permitted to use any personal electrical appliances.
- Defaulters will face strict disciplinary action, and the appliances will be confiscated.
- Tampering with electrical fittings is strictly forbidden.
- The college does not take responsibility for any mishaps related to electrical appliances.

5. Energy conservation Measures

- Residents must switch off fans and lights before leaving their rooms for night outs, day outs, or during college hours.

6. Academic Performance Requirements

- Students must secure a minimum of 25% aggregate marks in all subjects in the house examination.
- Students who do not meet this criterion or have a shortage of lectures will forfeit their hostel seat.

7. Attendance and Leave Policy

- Students must report at 6:00 pm every evening for attendance in the hostel courtyard.
- Adherence to hostel timings is mandatory.
- Students who remain absent from the hostel without valid reason may lose their hostel seat for the next semester.
- Staying in rooms to avoid classes is strictly prohibited and will result in disciplinary action.
- Students are not permitted to stay in the hostel during autumn, winter or summer breaks.

8. Security of personal valuables

- The security of personal belongings such as mobile phones, laptops, jewellery, and cash lies entirely with the resident. The hostel authorities will not be responsible for any loss or theft.
- Hostel students are not allowed to keep personal vehicles.

9. Appropriate Dress Code for Hostel and College Hours

- Residents are expected to dress in a manner that reflects decency and respect for the academic environment.
- Wearing nightwear, pajamas, extremely short clothes, or revealing attire is not appropriate while attending college, visiting the mess, or moving around the hostel premises during college hours.
- Students are kindly advised to maintain a neat, modest, and presentable appearance in common and academic areas, in line with the decorum of the institution.



Hostel Rules

10. Respect for Hostel Property and Shared Responsibility

- Furniture will be issued to the resident students against their signatures and the students will be held responsible for any breakage of furniture issued to her.
- Residents are expected to treat hostel property — including furniture, fixtures, doors, and walls — with care and respect.
- Vandalism, misuse, or negligent handling of any hostel infrastructure reflects a disregard for community values and will not be tolerated.

11. Ensuring a Drug-Free and Safe Hostel Environment

- The use, possession, or consumption of drugs, alcohol, tobacco, or any other intoxicating substance is strictly prohibited within the hostel and college premises.
- Such behavior is not only illegal but also harmful to health, personal development, and the collective well-being of the hostel community.
- Any resident found in possession of such substance, violating these rules will face immediate expulsion and legal action.

12. Zero Tolerance Policy for Ragging, Bullying, and Misconduct

Ragging is a criminal offence and is strictly prohibited in all forms, both on and off campus. Students involved in ragging will face disciplinary action, including rustication and legal prosecution. A safe and respectful environment is mandatory for all.

Strict disciplinary action, which may result in immediate expulsion, will be taken against students found involved in:

- Engaging in disruptive groupism
- Knocking on doors to disturb others or creating a hostile environment
- Residents are strictly prohibited from participating in any form of protest, strike, or collective disruptive activity within or outside the hostel premises.
- Such actions will be viewed as a serious breach of hostel discipline and may lead to immediate disciplinary action, including suspension or expulsion from the hostel.
- All residents are expected to maintain a respectful and inclusive atmosphere within the hostel premises.
- Parents of the defaulter students can be called by the hostel authorities any time, so they are advised to take the report of their wards from the hostel wardens from time to time. Habitual defiance of the hostel rules will render a resident student liable to disciplinary action, a special fine and even expulsion from the college.
- Students must give due respect to the wardens and hostel staff.

13. Cyber Safety and Responsible Digital Conduct

Any form of cyber crime, including online harassment, spreading rumors, or misuse of social media and digital platforms, is strictly prohibited.

- Residents are encouraged to report immediately to hostel authorities if they witness or become victims of any such digital misconduct. Prompt reporting helps ensure a safe and secure environment for all.



Hostel Rules

Medical Requirements

- It is mandatory to carry a Medical Fitness Certificate by an authorised Medical Practitioner at the time of entry to the hostel.
- The Medical Certificate should carry the information of the blood group of the student. If a student is suffering from any allergy or any medical problem, then the same should also be mentioned on the medical certificate.
- Non-disclosure of information related to any serious medical condition will result in the cancellation of the hostel seat. In case this fact is concealed from the authorities at the time of admission, the college will not be responsible for any emergency that may arise.
- Students are advised not to indulge in self-medication; if they do so, they will be responsible for the consequences.
- A nurse accompanied by an attendant is available on the campus 24X7 for any kind of medical aid. In case of emergency the student will be taken to the nearby government hospital/PGI.

Hostel Leave Rules

1. A resident student can avail night out /weekend leave only twice a month.
2. Wardens can grant leave only on weekends and not during college days and timings. Special permission of the Principal is required to leave the Hostel for attending birthday , engagement or wedding of relatives. The wedding card and a letter from parents with the proof of their identity should be attached with the leave application. In all such cases the parents must write directly to the Principal at least two days in advance. A maximum of 4 days leave will be granted for the wedding of siblings.
3. Residents will be granted permission to attend family functions only if they have the requisite attendance in classes, have appeared in the Mid-semester examinations, and have adhered to the rules and regulations of the college.
4. If any student extends her leave period of night stay, the parents/guardians should inform the hostel warden well in advance.
5. The warden can sanction leave upto 4 days. Any leave more than 4 days would require the sanction of the Principal.
6. Attendance will not be given for medical leave or any other leave taken by the student.
7. Students who do not report for 10 days without prior permission will have to vacate the hostel.



Hostel Rules

Rules for Outing

Timings for Outings:

Sundays and other Holidays

11:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. in Summer and Winter

Wednesday

3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. in Summer and Winter

1. Outings will be allowed to the residents only with the prior permission of parents/local guardians taken in writing.
2. Students are to be given permanent authority by their parents on a printed proforma on the basis of which they will be allowed to go out on their own (Printed forms will be available with the wardens).
3. Residents must enter their timings of departure and arrival in the outing register (Dayout/ Nightout/Coaching).
4. Residents shall strictly adhere to the timings of their return i.e. 6:00 p.m. in case of Dayouts and Nightouts. They must submit their joining to hostel warden after availing of nightout.
5. The warden has the right to deny outing to a resident in case of returning late from Night out/any kind of misconduct.
6. Students are expected to report on the day of the reopening of the college after the holidays, failing which it will lead to the cancellation of their Hostel Seat.
7. If a resident frequently overstays during her leave, her Hostel seat may be cancelled and it may also entail refusal of admission to the college in the next session.

Note: Day outings will be given according to the season and circumstances.

Mess Rules

1. Variety of good vegetarian food at reasonable rates is served in the hostel.
2. Fixed mess charges will be applicable for all resident students which will have to be paid according to the mess time schedule even if resident student does not join back the hostel after vacations/holidays for any reason whatsoever.
3. Meals will be served in the Dining Hall only.
4. Students must observe all mess rules in the Dining Hall.
5. Meals will not be served before or after the fixed hours. Residents must observe meal timings.
6. Residents are expected to come decently dressed to the dining hall.
7. Cooking area is not open to the residents.
8. Residents must behave properly with the Mess Staff.
9. Hostel and mess dues will be non refundable.
10. Only mess/hostel security will be refunded after submitting "No Dues Certificate".



Hostel Rules

For The Kind Attention Of Parents/Guardians

1. At the time of joining the hostel, the parents/local guardians are required to submit, the name and the address of the local guardians on the specified form.
2. It is mandatory for the parents to put down their signatures in front of the Hostel Committee.
3. Parents are advised to check the attendance card, mid-semester result and record of the day outs/night outs of their wards.
4. Students should open an SBI bank account in their home towns and carry the ATM cards along for convenient monetary transactions. The same can be operated from the SBI ATM in the college.
5. Change of address/telephone number to be informed to the warden in writing by the parents.
6. It is mandatory for Parents/local guardians of each student to meet the hostel authorities once a month to discuss the reports of their wards.
7. Parents of the defaulter students can be called by the hostel authorities any time.
8. The visitors will meet their wards at a place reserved for such meetings in the college campus.
9. No parents/guardians will be allowed to go to the resident's room.

Appointment Of Local Guardians

1. Appointment of a local guardian is a must for the hostel record of each resident student. In case of an emergency, local guardians will be informed and called.
2. Unmarried Men (blood relations and cousins) will not be accepted as local guardians and will not be allowed to enter the college premises.
3. Only a married couple should preferably be the local guardian. (Real brother/sister, married or unmarried is also eligible to be local guardian)
4. Only parents and guardians will be allowed to meet their wards from 3:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. on Saturdays and 10:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. on Sundays.
